COVID19!

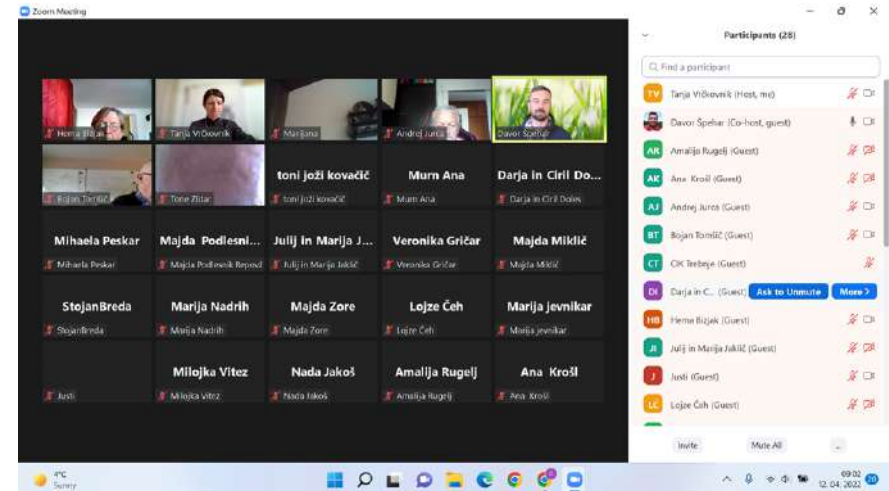
Results:

- Report and conclusions prepared

2. Small towns , short food supply chains

- How epidemic was influenced on behaviour of costumers to be more aware of healthy food?

period: September 2021 – March 2022

Results:

- 2 local debate (27th and 28th January 2022)

- participants: 28 people

- Conclusions: 1 mind map and written conclusions

- attending 3rd meeting and presenting results on local debates
